## The nolbreaks package\*

Use  $\nolbreaks{\langle some text \rangle}$  to prevent linebreaks in  $\langle some text \rangle$ . This has the advantage over  $\mbox{}$  that glue (rubber space) remains flexible. It has the disadvantage of not working in all cases! Most common cases are handled here ( $\linebreak$  is disabled, for example) but spaces hidden in macros or { } can still create break-points.

Large pieces of text with no breaks can cause problems with paragraph justification. Giving the package option [ragged] allows a line before the unbreakable text to be cut short.

You should declare \sloppy in your document.
